TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. The licensee shall comply with all aspects of the *Lottery Licensing Act* and *Regulations* and Appendix A. In the case of any discrepancy or dispute, the *Lottery Licensing Act* and *Regulations* shall prevail over Appendix A.
2. A copy of the licence must be displayed where players can examine it when the progressive lottery is being run. The licensee must provide a copy of the licence, on request, to anyone who has bought a ticket, or is being asked to buy a ticket, for a specific raffle.

TICKET SALES

3. Tickets will be sold for **\$10.00 each**.
4. The maximum number of tickets that can be sold before enacting the termination plan is **33,333**.
5. Tickets may only be sold between **6:00 pm** and **7:00 pm** at **Linda Rapp Landing** at the Robert Service Campground, located at **120 Robert Service Way, Whitehorse, Yukon** on:

6. **The draw dates for the progressive lottery cannot be changed after ticket sales have begun.** Once the licence has been issued, other changes can be considered by written request to the Registrar.
7. All ticket purchasers will be given a physical ticket stub which must be presented to claim the prize or play the jackpot game.
8. Tickets are only valid for the event at which they are purchased.

9. Tickets may not be sold to:
 - a. persons under 19 years of age;
 - b. persons involved in ticket sales for that event;
 - c. persons involved in mixing or drawing the winning ticket; or
 - d. persons who have handled the deck of cards.
10. The licensee must not give away or buy unsold tickets.

INITIAL (TICKET) DRAW

11. At **7:15 pm** on the approved event an announcement will be made stating the value of:
 - a. the initial (ticket) draw prize; and
 - b. the accumulating jackpot.
12. Following the announcement, a ticket will be drawn by any person over the age of majority who does not own a ticket or a share of a ticket in the draw in a manner that ensures fairness, transparency, and randomness.
13. The winning ticket number must be announced at least **three times** within 15-minutes of the draw. Should the winning ticket holder not come forward **within 15 minutes** of the draw, another ticket **must** be drawn. This will continue until a winner is verified.
14. The winning ticket holder must be present to claim the prize or participate in the jackpot draw.
15. The winning ticket will only be drawn once and will not be placed back in the container for further draw.
16. The licensee must securely store all non-winning ticket stubs by draw date for one year from the licence expiry.

JACKPOT DRAW (CHASE THE ACE)

17. The winning card for the jackpot draw will be the **Ace of Spades**.
18. Prior to the first jackpot draw:
 - a. a new deck of cards will be opened;
 - b. jokers and non-playing cards shall be removed, recorded, and destroyed.
 - c. The remaining deck shall consist of **52 playing cards**, including ace of spades.
19. Running the jackpot game:
 - a. The winning card (**ace of spades**) will be shown to be in the deck of cards.
 - b. The winning card will be returned to the deck and the cards shuffled.
 - c. The cards will be placed face-down on a table surface in front of the player, with no cards overlapping.
 - d. The cards cannot be cut or handled by a player at any time.

20. Draw process:

- a. The player of the jackpot game must be the winner of the ticket draw on that date. No proxies are permitted.
- b. The player of the jackpot game will select one card of their choice from the table surface.
- c. The licensee will reveal the selected card to all in attendance.

21. If the ace of spades **is not drawn**, the licensee must:

- a. show that the ace of spades remains in the deck of cards;
- b. record and destroy the card selected by the player;
- c. award the player the initial prize amount for that date in cash and record winner on tracking sheet; and
- d. secure the remaining cards for the next event.

22. If the player **did** select the ace of spades, the licensee must:

- a. award the player the initial prize amount for that date in cash and the jackpot amount by cheque within two weeks of the date the winning card is drawn;
- b. record each prize winner on the tracking sheet; and
- c. terminate the game and notify the registrar.

MAXIMUM JACKPOT

23. The licensee will keep a running total of the jackpot amount and will stop ticket sales if the jackpot reaches the maximum (**\$99,999**).

24. The termination plan set out in Appendix A shall be implemented if the jackpot reaches the maximum and is not won.

PRIZES

25. The gross ticket sales for each specific raffle shall be allocated in the following way:

- a. **Initial draw:** 20% must be awarded to the holder of the winning ticket of the initial (ticket) draw.
- b. **Jackpot:** 30% must be added to the accumulating jackpot.
- c. **Licensee:** 50% must be allocated to the licence holder for the objects specified in this Lottery Licence.

26. Necessary expenses, including licensing fees shall be deducted from the licensee portion of the gross sales.

ADVERTISING

27. Any advertisement for the raffle **MUST** include the licence number.

28. Tickets shall not be advertised or sold outside the Yukon but may be sold to non-residents who are visiting the Yukon.

SECURING MATERIALS

29. The licensee must ensure all tickets, cash, the deck of cards used in the in the jackpot game, and lottery equipment is secured between events and protected from loss or tampering.
30. If any cards become marked, bent, or otherwise identifiable the licensee shall contact the registrar and request to either:
 - a. Replace the identifiable card with a new, identical card; or
 - b. Replace the entire deck with the previously chosen cards removed.

BANKING AND FINANCES

31. Between events, cash holdings will be minimized. At a minimum, when the cash holdings reach \$5,000, cash will be deposited in the licensee's designated lottery bank account.
32. The licensee shall maintain all proceeds in a separate bank account. Such account shall be appropriately designated as a lottery account.
33. All withdrawals from the lottery account shall be for the purpose of payment of the necessary and reasonable expenses incurred in the operations and conduct of the progressive lottery or for the disbursement of the net proceeds for the charitable purpose as specified in this Lottery Licence.
34. The licensee must obtain receipts for each expense incurred.
35. Funds may not be moved from the designated lottery account to the licensee's operating or general account.
36. Any interest accrued in the account becomes part of the proceeds and must be used for the charitable purposes as specified in this licence.
37. If the designated lottery account contains proceeds from more than one lottery licence, the licensee must maintain separate ledgers outlining financial details for each lottery scheme conducted by licence number, including proceeds derived from each, expenses paid in the conduct of each and a list of how proceeds have been disbursed.

REPORTING

38. The licensee must submit financial returns to Professional and Corporate Affairs **on or before** the following dates:
- a. **Quarterly financial report**, tracking sheet, and ticket inventory control
 - i. **August 7, 2026**
 - ii. **November 7, 2026**
 - iii. **February 7, 2027**
 - b. **Final financial report** and 1% of total ticket sales
 - i. **June 6, 2027**, or within 30 days of the accumulating jackpot being won, whichever occurs first:
 - c. **Use of proceeds report**, and proceeds carryover application, if applicable
 - i. **December 6, 2027**
 - ii. **May 6, 2028**

39. Financial reports may be submitted by:

40. Failure to meet reporting requirements may result in an audit, at the expense of the licensee. It may also result in a denial of future lottery licences.
41. At the discretion of the Registrar of Lotteries an independent audit of the gaming activity may be required. All costs incurred for this audit are the responsibility of the organization.
42. The licensee must retain in the Yukon all records in connection with the lottery for at least **one year** after the expiration of the licence and must be available for inspection by the Registrar.

TERMINATION

43. The termination plan identified in Appendix A will be enacted:
- a. If the player of the jackpot game on the date the jackpot reaches \$99,999 (33,333 tickets are sold) does not select the ace of spades;
 - b. If directed to do so by the registrar; or
 - c. At the licensee's discretion on the day of a specific raffle after the jackpot game if the player of the jackpot game does not win the accumulating jackpot.
44. If the termination plan has been enacted, the licence holder must visually record all the elements related to the implementation of the plan.

NOTIFICATION OF REGISTRAR

45. The licensee must notify the Registrar within **one (1) business day** if any of the following events occur:

- a. the termination plan is implemented;
- b. the accumulating jackpot is won; or
- c. the licensee is unable to comply with the Regulations or the terms of the licence.

RAFFLE PROCEEDS

46. The proceeds from the progressive lottery shall be dispersed as follows:

APPENDIX A: TERMINATION PLAN

Termination Plan: End date reached

The following rules will apply for the final draw on **May 6, 2027**.

1. Ticket sales will take place at **Linda Rapp Landing at the Robert Service Campground** (120 Robert Service Way) from 6:00-7:00 pm on May 6, 2027.
2. The license holder will verify the winning ticket within 15 minutes of the initial draw.
3. Licence holder will announce the winning ticket number a minimum of three times within 15 minutes of drawing the ticket.
4. After the licence holder verifies the first ticket drawn, the ticket holder will draw **the Ace of Spades**, and will win both the initial draw and the accumulating **Ace of Spades** jackpot. The lottery then ends.

Termination Plan: Maximum jackpot reached

In the event the jackpot reaches the maximum of \$99,999 before the final date of May 6, 2027, a special event will be held to award the final jackpot draw on the draw date following the jackpot reaching its maximum.

1. The final draw will be announced through the Whitehorse Glacier Bears social media channels as well as through club communication channels.
2. Ticket sales will take place at **Linda Rapp Landing at the Robert Service Campground** (120 Robert Service Way) from 6:00-7:00 pm on the draw date following the jackpot reaching its maximum. No portion of ticket sales will be added to the jackpot amount.
3. The initial (ticket) draw will take place at 7:15 pm. The winning ticket number will be announced three times within 15 minutes. The ticket will be verified and the winner will receive the initial prize amount and will draw a card.
 - If the **Ace of Spades** is drawn, the winner will be awarded a cheque in the amount of the accumulated jackpot. The lottery then ends.
 - If the **Ace of Spades** is not drawn by the initial ticket holder, subsequent draws will be held in the same manner until the **Ace of Spades** is drawn. Subsequent validated ticket holders will have the opportunity to choose a card. Each subsequent validated ticket holder who does not draw the **Ace of Spades** will **NOT** be awarded a prize. When the **Ace of Spades** is drawn, the winner will be awarded a cheque in the amount of the accumulated jackpot.
 - Once the jackpot has been awarded one final draw with the remaining tickets will occur in the same manner as previous draws. The validated ticket holder will be awarded 30% of ticket sales for that day which would have been allocated to the progressive jackpot.

Termination Plan: License terminated by Whitehorse Glacier Bears or the Registrar

In the event that the termination plan is invoked by the license holder or the Registrar, a special event will be held to award the final jackpot draw.

1. The final draw will be announced through the Whitehorse Glacier Bears social media channels as well as through club communication channels.
2. Ticket sales will take place at **Linda Rapp Landing at the Robert Service Campground** (120 Robert Service Way) from 6:00-7:00 pm on the draw date following the termination plan being invoked.
3. The initial (ticket) draw will take place at 7:15 pm. The winning ticket number will be announced three times within 15 minutes. The ticket will be verified and the winner will receive the initial prize amount and will draw a card.
 - If the **Ace of Spades** is drawn, the winner will be awarded a cheque in the amount of the accumulated jackpot. The lottery then ends.
 - If the **Ace of Spades** is not drawn by the initial ticket holder, subsequent draws will be held in the same manner until the **Ace of Spades** is drawn. Subsequent validated ticket holders will have the opportunity to choose a card. Each subsequent validated ticket holder who does not draw the **Ace of Spades** will **NOT** be awarded a prize. When the **Ace of Spades** is drawn, the winner will be awarded a cheque in the amount of the accumulated jackpot.
